This is what it means to be...an AHEPAN

Since 1922, AHEPA has been in the forefront, meeting the challenges of our communities. The Order of AHEPA has been through many challenging decades of time. AHEPA assisted people in keeping their communities running during the depression of the 1930's. During World War II, AHEPA became an official issuer of World War II War Bonds, selling over \$300M (that is \$5 Billion today)!

In the 1950's and 60's AHEPA built hospitals and medical centers in Greece. We built statues and dedicated buildings to our ancestors, and we expanded our chapters into every city in America. In 1974 AHEPA led the charge to Washington, DC to fight the injustice in Cyprus. In the 1980's AHEPA donated millions in support of the youth; \$1M to St. Basil's, we created and maintained the AHEPA Educational Foundation which awards Scholarships, we created the AHEPA Housing Corporation. AHEPA Housing, which currently manages 96 facilities in the United States, provides safe and affordable homes for nearly 6,000 elderly residents. In 1986 AHEPA donated to the restoration of Statue of Liberty and in 1990 AHEPA donated \$1M to the restoration of Ellis Island.

In 2001, AHEPA took the lead and raised \$500,000 for 9/11 relief and assistance. We have raised \$1Billion since 1922 for aid to the United States and Greece. **AHEPA takes the lead and AHEPA Cares**. In 2019 AHEPA donated \$1Million to the restoration of the St. Nicholas Greek Orthodox Church and Shrine at Ground Zero. AHEPA continues to combat for the rights of all Hellenes and Defends Hellenism daily. In 2020 Supreme President Horiates assured the creation of an AHEPA burn unit at the Evangelismos Hospital in response to the MATI fires.

Today's COVID-19 pandemic, which spreads like nothing the medical community has seen, shows just how effective the AHEPA serves the communities. Our chapters are out in the field, feeding the frontline heroes, our Doctors and Nurses, Firemen and EMT's. AHEPA is donating blood, working to keep people safe and shopping for our elderly. AHEPA is the army of members which live all over the world. In Greece, the AHEPA is finalizing a donation to the Greek Police who are defending the border and in we are working with our hospitals to help the people in need education and training for the virus. The AHEPA wants to make sure our members remain safe

We salute all of you our members in District 20 on your hard work and efforts to make AHEPA the most preeminent organization of its kind. We need you! We want you! And We love what you all do for AHEPA!

On most Thursdays and Saturdays, we load the "Refuel Truck" up with Blankets, Clothes, Hygiene Kits put together by the St. George of the Desert Philoptochos and various food items. We head out to where the homeless gather and distribute 0ver 50 meals to those less fortunate. We recently met a parishioner "on the street" and were able to assist him in order that he could attend Sunday service.

As a side note, our truck was found in a field in Oxnard, CA several years ago and was restored by The Narrow Door volunteers to factory specifications including a hot and cold side.

The parishioners of St. George of the Desert have been more than generous with their donations to this cause.



The El Camino Real AHEPA District 20 Scholarship Foundation

Our Scholarship Foundation has issued scholarship awards based on the simple principle of applicants meeting the requirements as outlined in the annual scholarship application. Most recently, the annual number of applicants ranges from 10 to 25 undergraduate students. After ranking by academic achievement, extra-curricular activities, and community and church involvement (by an independent service), the Board of Directors of the Scholarship Foundation meet to determine the dollar value to be awarded to each student based on the cumulative value of the prior year's interest and dividends earned from the endowment fund. Higher ranking, or exceptional students in a discipline, usually are awarded more than others, depending on the available funds.

The Scholarship Foundation began with "a penny a day" call to the membership of District 20. Our first scholarship awarded in 1963 amounted to \$200.00. As our country rebounds from economic difficulties, our membership understands and continues to support the Scholarship Foundation with their chapter donations, Piggy Bank collections, pledges, and perpetual/memorial scholarship commitments. The Foundation has



been blessed by the membership of the AHEPA Family of District 20. The El Camino Real AHEPA District 20 Scholarship Foundation collectively thank each one of you for your continued support of our past, current, and future scholarship recipients - your sons and daughters; their sons and daughters; and beyond.

Since 1959 when the Scholarship Foundation was first funded; to 1963 and the first scholarship awarded; to when we award new scholarships, one individual has been present to guide the ever changing membership of the Board of Directors and to successfully manage our funds with his financial expertise. A heartfelt thank you goes to Brother Chris Compogiannis of Santa Barbara, California.
